Solidarity in alliance and global history

1968 was a year of offensives, uprisings, and demonstrations against capitalism and imperialism, for liberation and emancipation and the war in Vietnam was its epicenter. The events claimed many victories for democracy, equality, and emancipation, but also provoked deep, abiding repression.

A counterfeit history has subsequently erased police violence and the deaths of participants, removed workers, women, students, and indigenous peoples from the picture, and eliminated anti-Americanism, anti-imperialism, anti-capitalism, as well as the profound influences of the wars and interventions in Algeria, Latin America and Vietnam.

“Global ‘68” will retrieve the aspirations, energies, memories and histories of this worldwide movement and offers hope to a new generation of activists.

“Global ‘68” is a linked set of conferences, organized by Françoise Vergès, Marcus Rediker, Oscar Guardiola-Rivera, and Sylvie Robic, sponsored by the Collège d'études mondiales (FMSH), the University of Pittsburgh, Birkbeck (University of London), and the University Paris Nanterre, to be held in Paris May 2-4 and London May 5-6, 2018.

Events will focus on the movements and major shifts in politico-cultural sensibilities around the world that made 1968 such an extraordinary year. Three notions are central to this approach: solidarity in alliances, global history, and history from below.



The Collège d'études mondiales

In 2011, the Fondation Maison des sciences de l'homme created the Collège d'études mondiales to serve as a venue where projects led by international researchers are developed in a firmly pluridisciplinary framework.

The Collège d'études mondiales promotes new ways of thinking and working: the research efforts of the philosopher and the economist, of the doctor and the political scientist, of the literary scholar and the anthropologist, inform one another in their investigation of the changes that mark today's world.

Research activity is organized under three topic headings – “New norms and institutions”, “Rethinking the welfare state” and “Subjectivities: output and knowledge” – that aim to study these changes at the individual and systemic levels.

The Collège is organized around research chairs. Each chair is occupied by a prominent scholar (French or foreign) for a four-year term, with a team of associates and postdocs engaged in research, meeting invitations, seminars or lectures, and publication.

Certain research initiatives are also hosted in order to incubate research programmes on topics that are under-represented in France.

The Collège d'études mondiales benefits from the international mobility facilities and pluridisciplinary environment that are the hallmarks of the Fondation Maison des sciences de l'homme.
